- "46" = drugs.. usually marijuana
- "45" = Illegal Aliens
- "IAs" = Illegal Aliens
- "UDAs" = Illegal Aliens
- "UACs" = Unaccompanied Children
- "Bodies" = Illegal Aliens (unless they are really "10-7" (deceased)
- "10-7" = Out of Service - unavailable
- "10-15" = "in custody"
- "10-97" = Begin transport of juvenile/female.
- "Packers", "Mules" = drug smugglers
- "Bailout" = individuals who abscond from a traffic stop
- "Got Aways" - (literally)
- "TBS" = turned back south
- "POE" = Port of Entry
- "The Line" = the US/Mexico International Boundary
- "Omaha", "Liberty", Falcon" = Helicopters and Fixed Wing aircraft
- "Pushing" = tracking and literally "pushing" behind a group
- "USC" = U.S. Citizen
- "BOLO" = BE ON THE LOOKOUT
- "FTY" = Failure to Yield
